Since then, we have supported various causes locally and nationally with our programs:







The young **ALAS** of the **7th. Generation** continue to carry out their social projects. They constitute their projects and continue to learn from them.

All young people are becoming benchmarks for social initiatives, such is the success story of **Miriam Oros** from the community of San Isidro de las Colonias, who in this period and in connection with young people committed to social development and the delegate of her community.

They brought a mobile cinema unit to their community, this as an extra to their social project, in addition to actively participating in conducting summer courses for children.





EDUCATIONAL TRAINING:

- In this period from March to June, the ALAS youth participated as students in the Possibilities Center, enrolling in the courses of their choice, which were mainly: human rights, environmental education, and programming.
- Young ALAS of the 7th. And 2nd. Generation, received a talk on prevention against breast cancer by the Lupe Gómez Board of del Moral in alliance with the CASA program.
- Young ALAS of the 7th. Generation attended the Conference: Living with Purpose by the award-winning best dancer in Mexico, Isaac Martinez. It was possible thanks to the alliance with JuventudES Gto.



On the occasion of **Children's Day**, the young **ALAS of the 7th. Generation** carried out two volunteer activities.

The first was on **April 30** and consisted of visiting the **IMSS TI Hospital** located in the city of León to bring joy to the children who are hospitalized, in collaboration with **the Ángeles de Esperanza organization**, more than **1,000 toys** were donated and sweets, in addition to having a caravan through the streets of León where we gave toys to the children.

The 2nd activity consisted of visiting the "Lucas Ortiz Benitez" elementary school where the ALAS youth exposed to 368 children what it means to be a child, their rights and their obligations, ending in the preparation of a drawing that became a mural in the school., in which the children drew themselves what they would be like if they were a child with superpowers who stood up for children's rights, this activity was a reminder to reflect on how amazing it is to be a child.



5 young people from **ALAS** participated as volunteers in the **STEAM** course for children that was given at the **Center of Possibilities** in the month of May-June.

All the young **ALAS** of the **7th. Generation** participated as volunteers in the **1st. Centro Fox Robotics Tournament on June 24.**



ACHIEVED GOALS



During the second quarter, people from the community surrounding Vamos México, from the municipality of San Francisco del Rincón and León were assisted in health issues in direct support or channeling.

During this period, wheelchairs are delivered to patients who, due to their health situation, make it difficult to walk.

The most representative case is Jose Alejandro Durán, a 12-year-old boy with Cerebral Palsy who was given a clinical chair.

He supported Mrs. Victoria Navarrete and Maria Concepción Pombo with the purchase of additives, he supported the purchase of medicines for beneficiaries of the San Cristóbal community.
